3.0 NEW MEMBERS

4.0 POLICE REPORT

Shift patterns prevented police attendance, but a report on the month 20/09 to 20/10 had been emailed to the Secretary. For Beat 88 (South of Gallowhill Road) 4 crimes had been reported with one detected. One was a drink driver, 2 were thefts from vehicles and one under the telecommunications act (menacing text messages). In the case of Beat 89, there were 25 reported crimes, with 12 detections, covering 7 vandalism, 6 breaches of peace, 3 road traffic offences, 4 thefts, 3 assaults and 2 breaches of bail conditions.

There was a brief discussion of thefts from vehicles, where cars parked during church services were being targeted. Since the meeting more crimes of this nature have been reported and a LCC member reported on an incident during the following week where suspects were apprehended.

Two corrections had been made to the draft and the final version was accepted as correct.

6.0 MATTERS ARISING

6.1 Community Council Website

This had been implemented since the previous meeting and members commented favourably. There was discussion about publicising the website – in the first instance by contacting other local websites and offering to provide links, with the implication that they would provided corresponding links. This seems to be the main route to gain recognition via search engines. (The 'links' page was not operative at that stage but is now working.) Suggestions for further development will be welcomed

- 12.1 It was reported that a resident had raised certain questions relating to the Link Road design and these had been passed to the Chairman of K-I. Although the questions had not been referred to LCC, information had been obtained and is recorded here for reference:
 - It was always known that the Larkfield Centre staff would relocate to the KICC building, hence the construction of the temporary car park at the Woodilee Road location
 - The Larkfield Centre was excluded from the land sale to the Housebuilders' Consortium and will be sold at a future date
 - The traffic lights at this location were agreed with EDC at one of the earliest consultation meetings with them in order to ensure pedestrian safety when crossing the link road at this location/accessing the path network
 - The 30mph speed limit has been recommended by Fife Council, the independent safety auditor for the Link Road
 - The railway viaduct has been discussed, agreed and approved with Network Rail, Fife Council and the Police and complies with all recognised safety standards
 - The KLR is two lanes throughout its length

These points have been communicated informally to the resident.
